The Tarrant County Master Gardener Association met August 5, 2004, at the Resource Connection. There were 117 members in attendance. President JoAnn Hahn called the meeting to order at 11:05 a.m. **Shari Stanfield** read the May 13 minutes. One correction was made; TCMGA won second place in the club competition. Many thanks to **Mimi Lyles** and **Suzanne Mills** for their design and hard work in creating this display. The May minutes were approved as corrected. The June 3 minutes were approved as published.

Warren Tingley, treasurer, reported \$16,197 is currently in the treasury with no outstanding bills. Ways and Means has approximately \$2,000. The report will be filed for audit.
